A COVERING OF FAITH

"With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one." -Ephesians 6:16

When Paul wrote to the church at Ephesus about the shield of faith, he used the word *thureos*, which means "door." Roman soldiers' shields were large, rectangular, and door-sized. In other words, they covered every single part of the soldier's body. It's the same with our faith. The salvation we've been given in Christ covers us from head to toe. And because He is lavish in love and steadfast in keeping His promises, we'll always have enough for every situation we encounter.

The Roman soldiers' shields had one other distinctive quality: they were made of several hides of leather sewn together. This meant that every morning, a solider would have to rub oil into the shield in order to keep it pliable and to prevent it from drying out and cracking. This daily renewal was the difference between life and death... literally!

In our own faith walk, we must daily allow God's Holy Spirit to refill and reenergize us. The Spirit replenishes our joy, rebuilds our faith, and redirects our thoughts so that we can live boldly and courageously for Jesus. This begs the question: What have we done today to oil our shields? Let's not get complacent and allow distractions to deter us from our duty! In Christ, we have a true shield that won't ever let us down. Praise the Lord!


